More than 40 excellent papers have been published in IJCALLT after rigorous reviewing and revision processes. The Citescore of IJCALLT is also increased due to more citations from IJCALLT. These publications and increased citations indicate the quality and popularity of IJCALLT in recent years. I want to sincerely thank all dedicated associate editors, review board members and a number of anonymous reviewers for their incredible, consistent support and contributions to IJCALLT. They significantly helped IJCALLT sustain decent quality in computer-assisted language learning (CALL). I would also thank all authors' significant contributions to publications in IJCALLT.

Moreover, I sincerely thank all guest editors who edited special issues this year, including Carolin Fuchs, Marina Orsini-Jones, Kean Wah Lee, Chau Meng Huat, Priyadarshini Muthukrishnan, Rining Wei, Barry Lee Reynolds, Minjie Xing, Zhiyan Guo and Derek Hird. They also worked hard to adhere to the publication standards in IJCALLT and selected exceptional papers after organizing review processes. I am sincerely happy to work with them.

Papers published in IJCALLT in 2022 covered many topics in the CALL field, such as general online learning (Zou, et al, 2016), virtual exchange (Shih, 2020), MOOCs (Zhou, 2016), mobile language learning (Kohnke, 2020; Zou, et.al, 2018), online teaching and learning during the pandemic control (Gao & Zhang, 2020; Zou, et al, 2021) multimodal learning (Li, 2020) and intercultural issue (Oskoz & Gimeno-Sanz, 2020). These papers represent research in teaching and learning using various technologies and can significantly contribute to these fields. Among the papers published in IJCALLT in 2022, several articles were published in Open Access (OA) mode so that readers can download them without any charge fee.

In recent years, many journals have been converted to gold open access, and they are seeing an extraordinary increase in submissions and indexing inclusion. In order to make IJCALLT highly successful as many OA journals, with the support from the publisher, IGI Global, IJCALLT will also be converted to gold OA from 2023, making access to all its published contents moving forward freely available globally with no individual or institutional subscription required. This move will create tremendous opportunities for increased visibility of IJCALLT and is sure to accelerate the citation impact of published articles from authors. Greater content access also increases the potential of piquing the interest of other researchers in the CALL field for future collaboration and research funding opportunities. Thus, authors can benefit from OA publications. In order to help authors, we are working with a number of funding organizations and on various initiatives that will help researchers secure funding. We look forward to this OA move for IJCALLT and increasing visibility and citations for both authors and the journal.

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
